

The Vaccines for Children (VFC) program provides vaccines to children whose parents or guardians may not be able to afford them. This helps make sure that all children and teens can receive doctor-recommended vaccinations at **no cost**.

Can My Baby Get Free Vaccines?

Any child who is 18 years or younger and meets one of these requirements:

- Receives health insurance through Medicaid or PeachCare for Kids Program
- **Underinsured** (Your child has health insurance, but it doesn't cover certain recommended vaccines)
- **Uninsured** (Child has no health insurance coverage)
- American Indian or Alaska Native

A Vaccines for Children (VFC) Program provider cannot refuse vaccination for a VFC Program-eligible child due to the parent's or guardian's inability to pay for vaccine administration.
